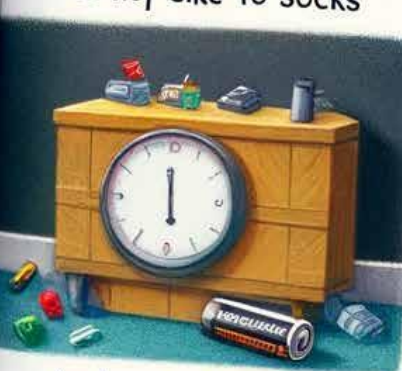

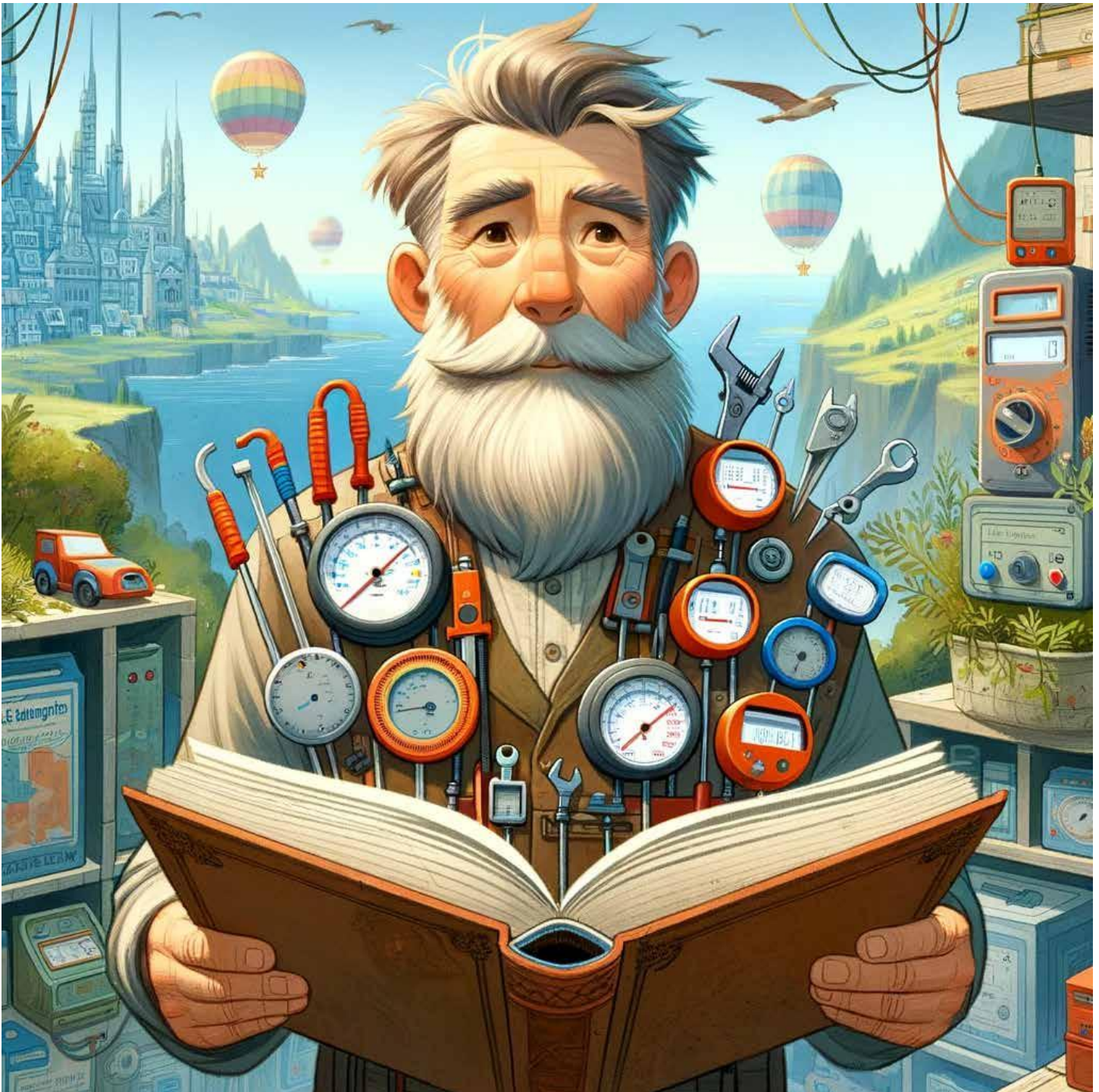

The rules must be changed, they all agreed.

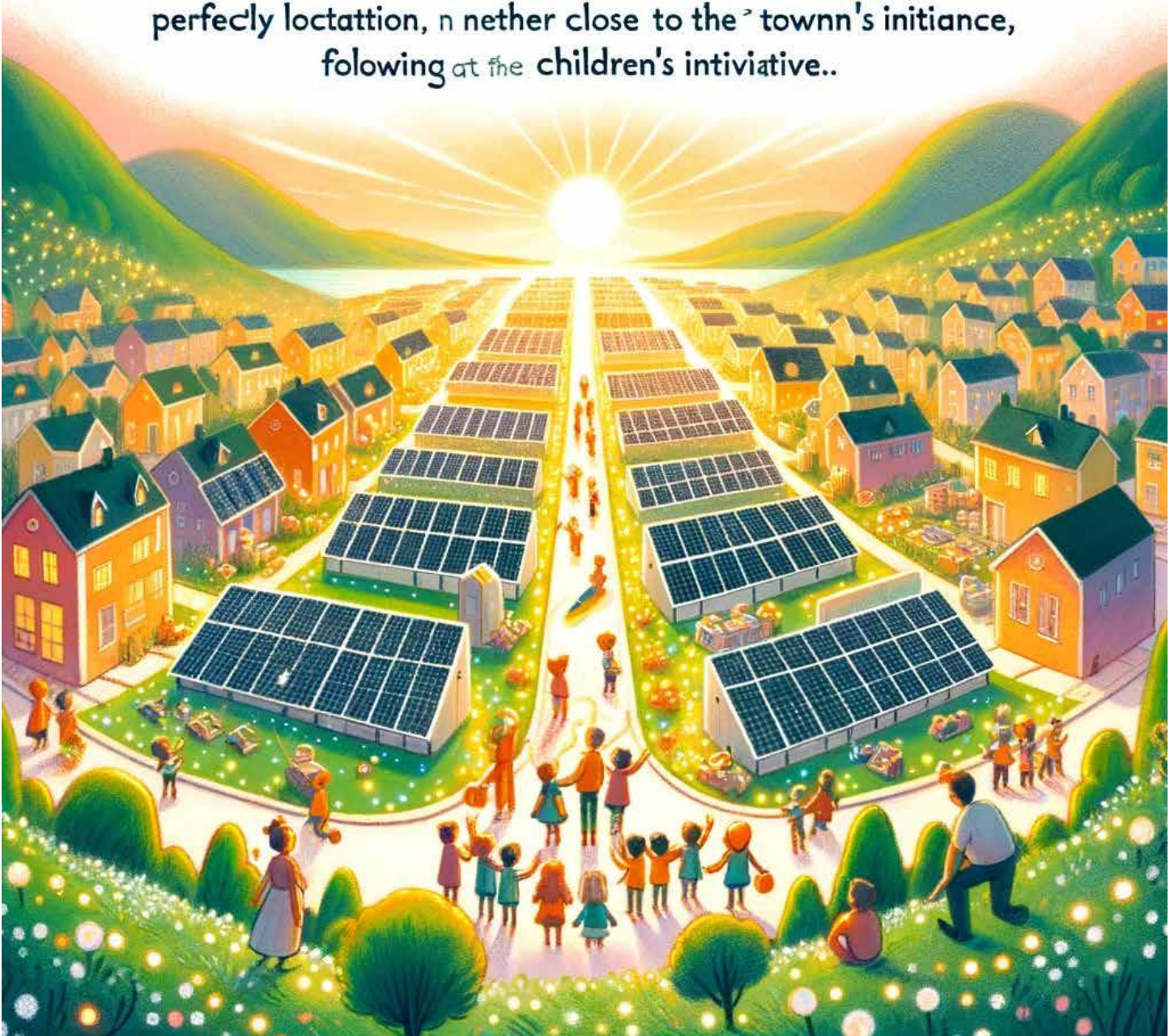
